

MAY 2026 REVIEW

CASS COUNTY COURT & PRETRIAL SERVICES

“Serving the community by using evidence-based practices and needs-based supervision that prioritizes public safety, maximizes court appearance and reduces recidivism, while protecting the presumption of innocence.”

CURRENT OVERVIEW:

In May, Cass County Pretrial Services served 140 clients, resulting in 3,698 jail bed days saved, 10 years diverted. The program currently supervises 115 clients, a 10% increase from April, with an average daily population of 119 clients. To date, the program has served 211 clients in 2026, representing 55% of the total population served in 2025. Felony cases account for 77% of cases. Staff completed 24 arrestee evaluations and enrolled 28 new clients, reflecting a 65% increase in enrollments compared to the previous month. The program has experienced an average 60% increase in new clients over the past two months, demonstrating continued growth in program utilization. 9 clients successfully completed supervision. The program's commitment to people centered supervision & voluntary supportive services remains a cornerstone of its operations. During May, 70 clients voluntarily participated in individual counseling services through PAK, representing 61% of the active caseload and an 11% increase from April. Demand for therapeutic services continues to grow, with the counseling team currently scheduling appointments two weeks in advance, with a waitlist. 39 clients actively engaged with Peer Recovery Specialists through the partnership with 4C Health. To date, the program has facilitated 34 voluntary inpatient treatment placements in 2026, with 4 clients currently participating in inpatient treatment. These collaborative efforts continue to support client stability, address underlying behavioral health needs, and promote long-term success while maintaining public safety.

JAIL ANALYSIS:

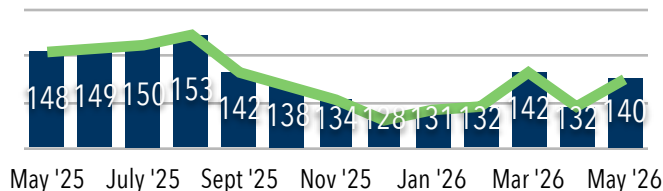
The May Jail Analysis showed that 14% of inmates are classified as pre-adjudication. The Cass County Jail

population is 204 inmates: 130 Cass County, 56 Howard County, and 18 IDOC. Currently, the jail is at 66% capacity. It is estimated that without Pretrial Services the jail would be at 1% overcapacity. The low-risk population is 3%, illustrating the effective reservation of jail resources

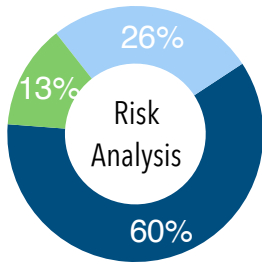
COST SAVINGS:

CCCPS has diverted an estimated \$4,600 per day in incarceration expenses, resulting in a reported cost savings of \$147,920 in May. Due to this reservation of jail resources, the CCJ can now house inmates from other facilities, generating an additional \$68,00 in revenue in May due to the space generated by the Pretrial Release Program.

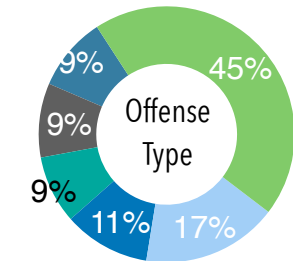
RISK & OFFENSE TYPE ANALYSIS :

Risk Analysis:

Trends show that 13% of active clients have been identified through the IRAS-PAT as High Risk, 60% as Moderate Risk, and 26% as Low Risk. Low risk does not equate to low need.

Offense Type Analysis:

Analysis shows that 45% of offenses are drug and alcohol related, 17% traffic offenses, 11% crimes against persons, 9% property related, 0% weapon related, 9% public health and admin., and 9% fall into the other category.



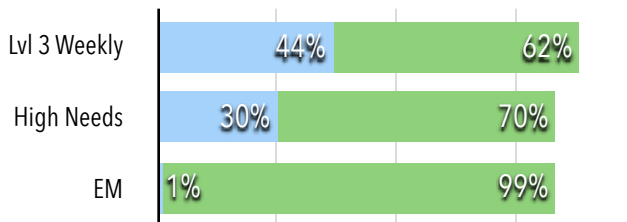

Level 3 (High) Supervision, with weekly reporting.

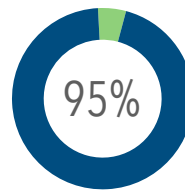
- 30% of active clients have needs for which supervised release was determined to be in the best interest of the clients and county.
- 1 client is being supervised with electronic monitoring facilitated by Cass/Pulaski Community Corrections.



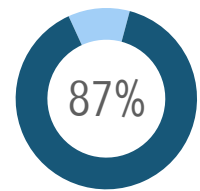
CASS COUNTY LOCAL JRAC:

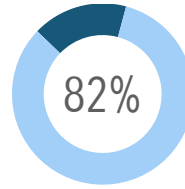

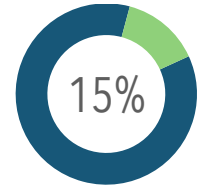
Appearance Rate:
percentage of defendants who attended all court hearings during their pretrial period



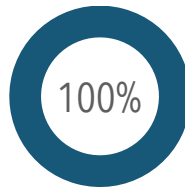
Safety Rate:
the percentage of defendants who were not charged with a new offense during their pretrial period



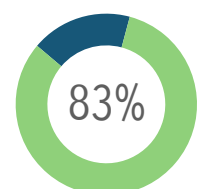
Success Rate:
