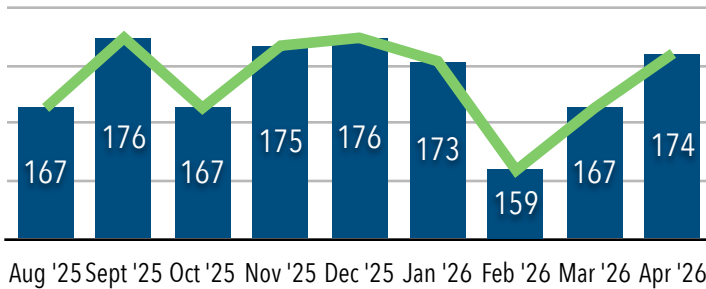

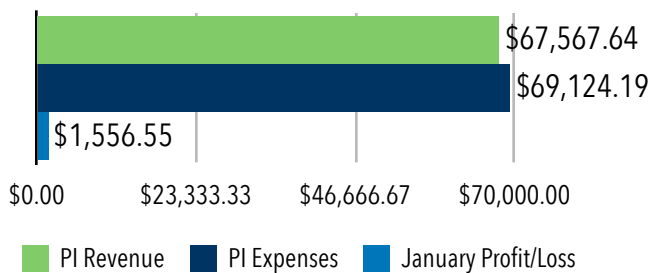
Monthly Clients Served 9 Month Trend



WORK RELEASE UPDATES:

There are presently 32 work release residents: 23 males and 9 females. The Work Release Facility is currently at 62% capacity, 58% capacity for males and 75% capacity for females.

APRIL OVERVIEW:

Community Corrections served a total of 174 clients in April, a 4% increase, including 39 through the Work Release Program and 135 through the Home Detention/Electronic Monitoring Program, for a total of

4,779 supervision days. It is noted that 18 clients were transferred to other jurisdictions for supervision. The average daily Work Release Population was 30, while the average for Home Detention was 127.

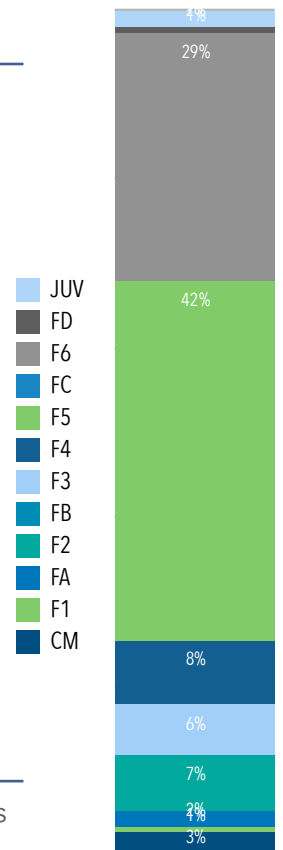
The department received 22 new clients in April:

- 9 Level 6 Felonies
- 0 High Level Felonies (Lvl 5 & Above)
- 1 Criminal Misdemeanors
- 0 Juvenile GPS Supervision

17 clients successfully completed the program. One client was returned to either the Cass or Pulaski County Jail on a pending violation, with 8 currently held in the CCJ on pending violations.

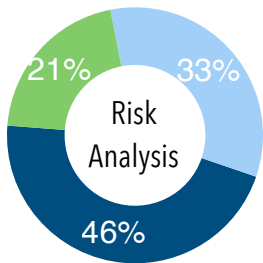

POPULATION ANALYSIS:

- 39 Work Release Clients
- 135 Home Detention Clients
- Approximately 15 Clients participated in Work Crew; working on various projects
- 14 CTP Clients
- 18 Courtesy Transfers
- 138 clients were serving a term originating from Cass County, a 7% decrease, while 30 were serving a sentence from Pulaski County
- 1 clients participated in Juvenile GPS Monitoring

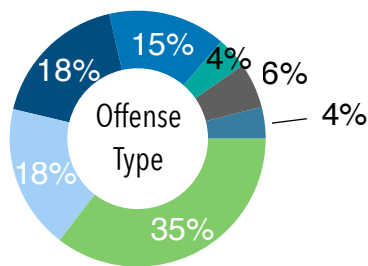
RISK & OFFENSE TYPE ANALYSIS:



- Very High/High
- Low
- Moderate

Risk Analysis: Analysis shows that 21% of clients served in April were identified through the IRAS Community Supervision Tool as High Risk to Very High Risk, 46% as Moderate Risk, and 33% as Low Risk.

Offense Type Analysis:



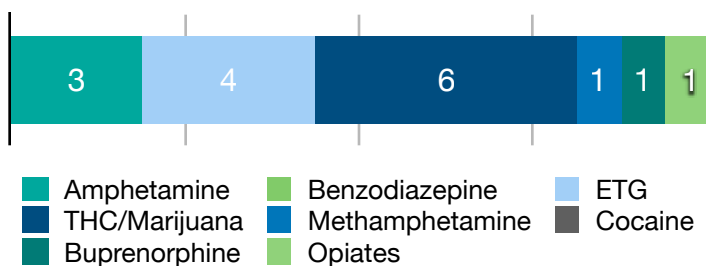
- Alcohol & Drug

Analysis shows that 35% of offenses are drug and alcohol related, 18% are traffic offenses, 18% are crimes against persons, 15% property related, 4% weapon related, 6% public health and admin., and 4% fall into the other category.

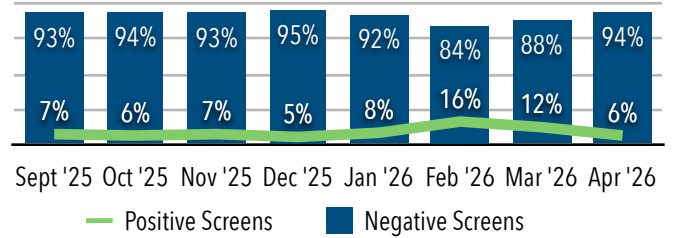
DRUG SCREEN ANALYSIS:

Out of 213 drug screens administered this month, 6% were positive. The majority of positive screens were for THC & ETG that were handled administratively

Positive Screens by Drug

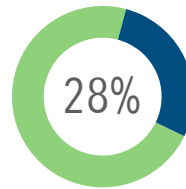


Percent Positive Screens 8 Month Trend

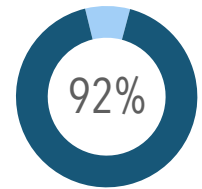


PERFORMANCE METRICS:

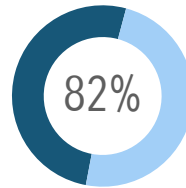
At the direction of our local JRAC, the agency is now tracking the following performance metrics.



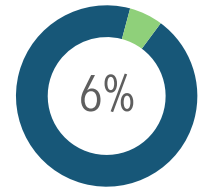
Violation Rate: the percentage of clients who received a violation; pending violations are NOT included; this is a measure of closed cases.



Safety Rate: the percentage of clients who do not commit a new offense while under supervision; this is a measure of closed cases.



Completion Rate: the percentage of clients who remain under supervision until the end of their sentence.



Drug Screen Positivity Rate: the percentage of drug screens administered that return a positive result

NOTABLE UPDATES:

- Director Hartoin completed and submitted the 2027 Indiana Department of Correction (IDOC) grant applications. The grant materials are now available.
- The 2025 Annual Report has been finalized and distributed, highlighting program outcomes, community impact, and operational achievements.
