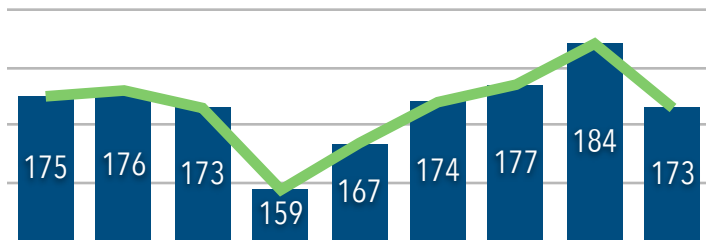

WORK RELEASE UPDATES:

The Work Release Facility currently houses 30 residents, including 23 males and 7 females, and is operating at 57% of overall capacity, consistent with last month's occupancy levels. The male dorm is operating at 57% capacity, a 21% decrease, while the female dorm is operating at 58% capacity, a 75% increase from June.

JULY OVERVIEW:

In July, Community Corrections served 173 clients, a 6% decrease over the previous month. This included 44 clients participating in the Work Release Program and 129 clients supervised through the Home Detention/Electronic Monitoring Program, accounting for a combined 4,968 days supervised. In addition, 23 clients were transferred to other jurisdictions for supervision.

The average daily population was 31 in Work Release and 128 in Home Detention, reflecting continued reliance on community-based supervision as an alternative to post-conviction incarceration.

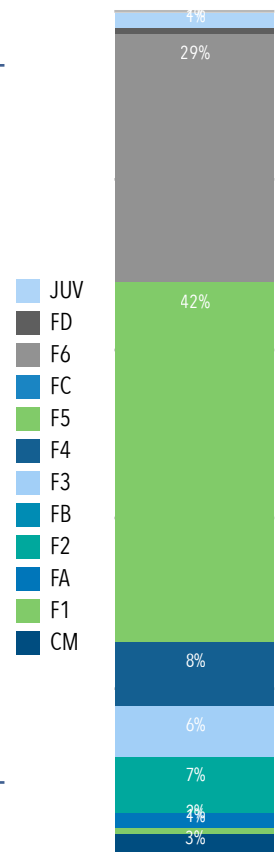
The department received 18 new clients in July, a 33% decrease :

- 8 Level 6 Felonies
- 8 High Level Felonies (Lvl 5 & Above)
- 2 Criminal Misdemeanors
- 0 Juvenile GPS Supervision

This month, 25 clients successfully completed Community Corrections supervision, demonstrating continued progress toward successful reintegration into the community. Conversely, 11 clients were returned to the Cass or Pulaski County Jail on alleged program violations. Of those individuals, 13 remain detained in the Cass or Pulaski County Jail pending court disposition.

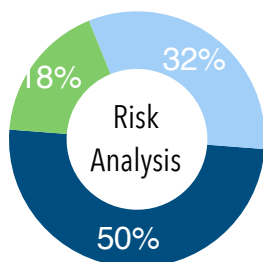

POPULATION ANALYSIS:

- 44 Work Release Clients
- 128 Home Detention Clients
- Approximately 15 Clients participated in Work Crew; working on various projects
- 9 CTP Clients
- 18 Courtesy Transfers
- 139 clients were serving a term originating from Cass County, while 27 were serving a sentence from Pulaski County
- 4 clients participated in Juvenile GPS Monitoring



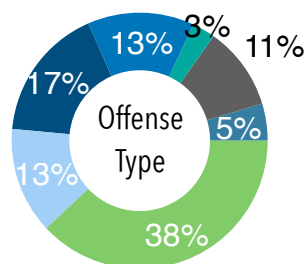

RISK & OFFENSE TYPE ANALYSIS:

Risk Analysis: Analysis shows that 18% of clients served in July were identified through the IRAS Community Supervision Tool as High Risk to Very High Risk, 50% as Moderate Risk, and 31% as Low Risk.

Offense Type Analysis:

Analysis shows that 38% of offenses are drug and alcohol related, 13% are traffic offenses, 17% are crimes against persons, 13% property related, 3% weapon related, 11% public health and admin., and 5% fall into the other category.

DRUG SCREEN ANALYSIS:

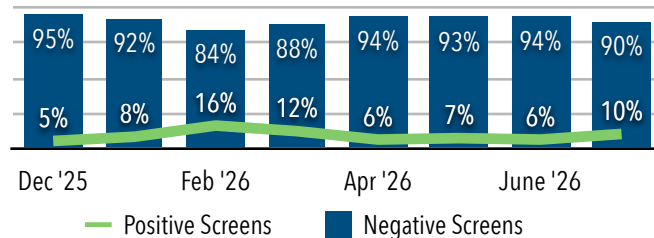
Out of 158 drug screens administered this month, 10% were positive, a 75% increase. The majority of positive screens were for THC (20% increase) & ETG (Alcohol).

Positive Screens by Drug



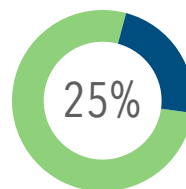

Percent Positive Screens 8 Month Trend

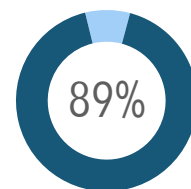


PERFORMANCE METRICS:

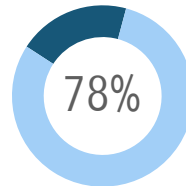
At the direction of our local JRAC, the agency is now tracking the following performance metrics.



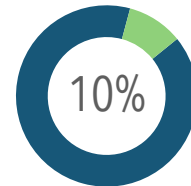
Violation Rate: the percentage of clients who received a violation; pending violations are NOT included; this is a measure of closed cases.



Safety Rate: the percentage of clients who do not commit a new offense while under supervision; this is a measure of closed cases.



Completion Rate: the percentage of clients who remain under supervision until the end of their sentence.



Drug Screen Positivity Rate: the percentage of drug screens administered that return a positive result

NOTABLE UPDATES:

- As of August 4, the department has fully launched the Journeys AI Notetaker and Justice System Partners (JSP) Coaching Certification Program. The AI Notetaker is now being used to record all client interactions to support fidelity monitoring, coaching, documentation quality, and continuous quality improvement.
- The next Community Corrections Advisory Board meeting is scheduled for August 19.
