Monthly Clients Served 9 Month Trend



WORK RELEASE UPDATES:

There are presently 33 work release residents, a 32% increase: 17 males and 6 females. The Work Release Facility is currently at 63% capacity, 48% capacity for males and 66% capacity for females.

AUGUST OVERVIEW:

Community Corrections served a total of 167 clients in June: 50 via the Work Release Program and 117 via the Home Detention/Electronic Monitoring Program for a total of 4,864 days supervised. It is noted that 26 clients

were transferred to other jurisdictions for supervision. The average daily Work Release Population was 40, while the average for Home Detention was 109.

The department received 15 new clients in August, a 46% increase:

- 9 Level 6 Felonies
- 3 High Level Felonies (Lvl 5 & Above)
- 1 Criminal Misdemeanors
- 2 Juvenile GPS Supervision


19 clients successfully completed the program, while 3 clients were returned to either the Cass or Pulaski County Jail on a pending violation, with 8 held in the CCJ on pending violations.

POPULATION ANALYSIS:

- 50 Work Release Clients
- 117 Home Detention Clients
- Approximately 15 Clients participated in Work Crew; working on various projects
- 11 CTP Clients
- 11 Courtesy Transfers
- 122 clients were serving a term originating from Cass County, while 25 were serving a sentence from Pulaski County
- 9 clients participated in Juvenile GPS Monitoring



RISK & OFFENSE TYPE ANALYSIS:


Risk Analysis: Analysis shows that 23% of clients served in August were identified through the IRAS Community Supervision Tool as High Risk to Very High Risk, 47% as Moderate Risk, and 30% as Low Risk.


Offense Type Analysis:

Analysis shows that 43% of offenses are drug and alcohol related, 8% are traffic offenses, 19% are crimes against persons,9% property related, 4% weapon related, 10% public health and admin., and 8% fall into the other category.



Out of 176 drugs screens administered this month, 4% were positive, a 4% decrease. The majority of positive screens were for alcohol and THC.



PERFORMANCE METRICS:

At the direction of our local JRAC, the agency is now tracking the following performance metrics.



Violation Rate: the percentage of clients who received a violation; pending violations are NOT included; this is a measure of closed cases.



Completion Rate: the percentage of clients who remain under supervision until the end of their sentence.




Safety Rate: the percentage of clients who do not commit a new offense while under supervision; this is a measure of closed cases.
