FINANCIAL NEEDS & BUDGETS

Directors Hartoin & Wegner to presented their financial needs and budgets for CY2025. Other council members/departments to present if they wish to participate. It is one of the objectives of our Local JRAC to provide the County Council with information regarding the fiscal needs and services provided by our entire criminal justice system not only before the upcoming budget sessions, but throughout the year. June's JRAC Meeting will include County Council Members and be focused on this topic to prepare for the upcoming budget hearings.

REDEFINING PRETRIAL SUPERVISION RESEARCH STUDY

Director Hartoin shared that IOCS has funded the Redefining Pretrial Supervision Study that is based on Cass County's Pretrial Supervision Model that includes structured appointments and voluntary support services integration. We have partnered with George

Mason University and have so far, 10 counties signed up for our multi-site, randomized controlled trial of this model.

CY2025 JPAR SIM GRANT

Court Services Director, Hillary Hartoin, related that she has submitted the CY25 IOCS JPAR SIM Grant last week and is seeking to increase funding and services covered under the grant umbrella. Funding is designated for CPCC's therapeutic division, with additional funding awarded for competency evaluations for the Courts and EBP curriculum. Court Services has also been working with a new provider to expand programming offered at CPCC to include both a Men's & Women's DBT Group and a Men's Trauma Group.

DEFINING RECIDIVISM

Judge Swaim and Director Hartoin presented a proposed definition of recidivism. Discussion took place and the following agreed upon definition was established. Work continues on defining enhanced data points to track and developing a plan to collect this data.

RECIDIVISM RATE

The percentage of defendants who complete community supervision and who are not charged with a new criminal offense one (1), three (3) and five (5) years after completion of supervision.

<u>COMMENTARY:</u> The recidivism rate measures defendants who have not been arrested and charged OR summoned and charged with a new criminal offense (misdemeanor or felony). Thus, those who have been summoned to court for a new offense should also be included along with information learned about charges in other jurisdictions. Failed Diversions resulting in conviction and future violations of community supervision should also be included.

<u>TYPE OF MEASURE:</u> Case-related; measured at the end of community supervision period. While unified definition, each community supervision agency would calculate their own recivisdism rate.

<u>ENHANCED DATA POINTS:</u> Data will be collected in a manner to filter and report by disposition, guilty, plea by agreement, dismissal pursuant to a plea, etc.
