

AUGUST 2021 PROGRAM SNAPSHOT

CASS/PULASKI COMMUNITY CORRECTIONS

MISSION:

Cass/Pulaski Community Corrections is committed to improving the quality of life of the program participants and the community by applying effective evidence based programs that produce positive choices, constructive behavior and accountability from the program participants, thereby reducing their criminal actions

VISION: To beat all aspects of recidivism.

WORK RELEASE REOPENING:

While we have continued to try to return the Work Release Facility to normal operations, until renovations are complete, we try to balance meeting the placement needs of the Courts with limiting our population to reduce risk and protect clients and staff. Clients are able to maintain employment, but are not awarded community passes or allowed to participate in outside peer recovery meetings, unless they have received their COVID-19 Vaccine to limit exposure. Currently we have 26 residents in facility. 80% percent have been voluntarily vaccinated and we had no residents or staff test positive since reopening. Work Crew residents continue to participate in the therapeutic model and all residents participate in programming, including MRT, Process Groups and New Directions.

JULY OVERVIEW:


In July, Community Corrections served 169 clients, a 3% increase from last month. We served 30 clients in the Work Release program and 139 via the Home Detention/Electronic Monitoring program. We had an average daily population of 148 clients. The department received 25 new clients in July:

- 10 Level 6 Felonies or Class D Felonies
- 12 High Level Felonies (Lvl 5 & Above)

• 3 Misdemeanors

17 clients completed the program, a 21% increase, while 6 clients were returned to either the Cass County or Pulaski County Jail on a violation.


Individuals may be less than component totals due to dual component supervision and transfers.


• Population Analysis:

- 30 Work Release Clients
- 139 Home Detention Clients
- 30 Clients participated in Work Crew
- 12 CTP Clients
- 25 Courtesy Transfers
- 135 clients were serving a term originating from Cass County, while 21 were serving a sentence from Pulaski County.
- 11 are participating in Juvenile Community Corrections or GPS Monitoring.

• Offense Type Analysis:

 Analysis shows that 36% are drug and alcohol related offenses, 15% crimes against property, 18% crimes against persons, 3% weapon related offenses, 10% public health and admin. offenses, 13% traffic offenses and 5% fall into the other category.






• Drug Screens:

• Out of 135 drugs screens administered this past month, 8% were positive as illustrated above.

• Risk Analysis:

 Analysis shows that 22% of active clients have been identified through the Indiana Risk Assessment as High Risk to Very High Risk, 47% as Moderate Risk, and 31% as Low Risk



• A review of the IRAS-CST's conducted show an average risk reduction of -95.% in April.

NOTABLE UPDATES:

- CY2022 IDOC Grant Application Awards will be announced September 9th.
- In Collaboration with the Cass County Sheriff's Department, Staff participated in Defensive Tactics Training.
- In addition to caring for the greenhouse and flowers placed throughout town, Work Crew completed over 300 hours of community service in July.
- We have expanded our class schedule to include an additional MRT class, Anger Management, Relapse Prevention, and a Women's Beyond Trauma Group. All classes are also available online in our virtual classroom, pictured below.
